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**Lockhart River Entry
PERMIT**

- On the 24th of March 2020, The Local Disaster management Group working with Council, resolved to close Lockhart River Community to all travellers apart from those who are classed as essential services.
- Entry will be by approved permit only
- Essential services at this point in time are as follows:
 - Emergency Services
 - Primary Health care Doctors, Nurses, and others as approved by the Director of Nursing, Lockhart River Clinic.
 - Ergon for electrical repairs and power continuity
 - Telstra for communications continuity
 - Sea Swift to continue to provide supply of food and materials
 - Other services and individuals subject to approval via the permit system
- All permits will be appraised on a case by case basis and applicants should expect to be interviewed by the Lockhart River Clinic
- Each permit will be issued an approval number
- Nobody will be able to book a flight to Lockhart River without an approval number
- Lockhart River Police may be called on to check patrons getting off flights as a second insurance against unauthorised access.

Biosecurity (Human Biosecurity Emergency) (Human Coronavirus with Pandemic Potential) (Emergency Requirements for Remote Communities) Determination 2020

Special Consideration to Enter Communities

Entry requirements back to designated area

The following applies to the person entering the area:

- a) Immediately before the entry, the person does not have any of the signs or symptoms of human coronavirus with pandemic potential.
- b) In the last 14 days immediately before entry, the person has not been outside Australian territory.

This subsection applies to a person entering a designated area if, throughout the 14 days before entering, the person:

- a) Has been isolated from the general public; and
- b) Has not had signs or symptoms of human coronavirus with pandemic potential; and
- c) Has not been exposed to:
 - i. Human coronavirus with pandemic potential; or
 - ii. Another person with one or more signs or symptoms of human coronavirus with pandemic potential.

For extenuating circumstances where these requirements cannot be met further consideration maybe made by completing the below. Advice will be provided to the relevant decisionmaker regarding Human Biosecurity advice on this request.
