Issue: Councilor Vacancy – Bi-Election

CEO advised the Bi-Election will be held over the period 11th- 13th October to be run

by ECQ using a mobile booth methodology.

Issue: Illegal alcohol sales

The community continues to be impacted on by illegal alcohol sales. School attendance, hospital presentations and general community civility is directly aligned to the illegal alcohol sales going on.

#### Issue: Break-ins by juveniles to workshop and other areas.

Council has received multiple complaints against kids stealing fuel, tools, and batteries in order to keep a couple of old cars running. This is creating an unregistered, uninsured, un-roadworthy vehicle, and unlicensed driver problem. It is a genuine concern for Council's road gang and traffic control teams and is a real risk to the kids involved driving on bush roads at night. The other problem is while the juveniles are breaking in they are causing considerable damage to the workshop noting three roller doors have been damaged which will cost many thousands of dollars to repair. Many tools have also been taken which leaves our tradesmen and apprentices unable to do their job.

**Resolution 4:** That charges be laid against the juveniles once identified
